There have been robust debates on the integration of indigenous education into national curricula Nozaki, 2014; Breidlid, 2013, 2012) and initial attempts to include indigenous knowledge in the curriculum have sometimes met with resistance from different people who have varied views about the specific knowledge items which should be included (Hodson, 2009).

### Back to Basics: Integrating African Indigenous Education ...

An inquiry was embarked on in order to train the science teachers in how to integrate indigenous knowledge in the science classrooms. A workshop was chosen as an intervention to improve the teaching skills of the teachers and to develop new methods of teaching. A quasi-experimental design was chosen to establish how effective the intervention was.
