Three main style of temple architecture are the Nagara or the Northern style, the Dravida or the Southern style and the Vesara or Mixed style. But at the same time, there are also some regional styles of Bengal, Kerala and the Himalayan areas. One important part of the ancient Indian temples was their decoration.

'Sanchi 17' may look basic but it holds the seeds of temple architecture in India. Sanchi 17 is dated to around 400 CE or the late 4th or early 5th century CE, during the reign of Gupta dynasty. Most scholars agree that the temple was used for Buddhist worship.

The temple was ornately decorated often even to the dark shrine rooms lighted only by flickering oil lamps. Ideavy cornices, strong pillars wide in proportion to their height and the broad base of the Sikhar or tower give to Indian temple architecture a feeling of strength and solidity.

From the architecture and imagery, it is known that the temple was built in early 6th century CE. Panchayatana Style of architecture. Main shrine is built on a rectangular plinth with four subsidiary shrines that are smaller and at the 4 corners. Hence, there are a total of five shrines and hence the name, Panchayatana.

Let us turn our attention once again towards the South of India, where the Dravidian style of temple architecture flourished roughly from the 8th century to about the 13-14 century A.D. Unlike the North, the South is literally dotted with thousands of temples, having been relatively free from repeated foreign invasions to which the North was subject.

Of the different styles of temple architecture in India, the Nagara architecture of northern India and the Dravidian architecture of southern India are most common. Other styles are also found. For example, the rainy climate and the materials of construction available in Bengal, Kerala, Java and Bali Indonesia have influenced the evolutions of styles and structures in these regions. [53]

For most modern writers, nagara refers to north Indian styles, most easily recognised by a high and curving shikhara over the sanctuary, dravida or Dravidian architecture is the broad South Indian style, where the superstructure over the sanctuary is not usually extremely high, and has a straight profile, rising in series of terraces to form a sort of decorated pyramid (today often dwarfed in larger temples by the far larger gopuram outer gateways, a much later development).

The architecture of Hindu temples evolved over a period of more than 2,000 years and there is a great variety in this architecture. Hindu temples are of different shapes and sizes — rectangular, octagonal, semicircular — with different types of domes and gates. Temples in southern India have a different style than those in northern India.

Hindu Temples (History, Locations, Architecture)

Many temples in Central India and Deccan have used the Vesara style with regional modifications. It is a fusion style of both Nagara and Dravida styles of temple architecture. Temples built by later Chalukyas of Kalyani and Hoysalas are considered as the examples of Vesara style.
