## **Pathology Outlines - Breast**

A pathology report is a medical document that gives information about a diagnosis, such as cancer. To test for the disease, a sample of your suspicious tissue is sent to a lab.

## **Concordance with breast cancer pathology reporting**

...  
Tumor size is most  
often reported in  
centimeters or  
millimeters (1 inch =  
2.54 centimeters =

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25.4 millimeters). The best way to measure tumor size is under a microscope (especially for small tumors). The longest length of the tumor in the specimen (the tissue removed during surgery) is reported as the tumor size.

Extranodal  
involvement has been



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reported to occur in almost every organ system, with or without concomitant nodal disease. The breast is a rare site of presentation of this disease. Case: A 35-year-old male presented with a hard, nodular swelling in the lower and outer quadrant of the right breast, with a clinical suspicion of malignancy. A diagnosis of sinus

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histiocytosis with massive lymphadenopathy, or RDD, was offered based on the presence of numerous lymphocytes, plasma cells, a few ...

## **Rosai-Dorfman disease of the breast in a male: a case report**

Some pathologists in the scheme report only breast biopsies and resected breast

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specimens, whereas others are generalists reporting specimens from a wide variety of body sites including breast. This difference in work is reflected in the variation in the number of breast cancers reported (range, 45–900/year).

**The NHS breast screening programme (pathology) EQA ...**  
Breast cancer which is

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spread beyond the breast and is growing in a distant organ such as the bones, liver, lung or brain. Small clusters of calcium that are visible on mammogram and can be associated with either benign processes (such as fibrocystic changes ) or atypical processes (such as DCIS or invasive cancer).
